Here are a few ideas to get you started. Make these Christmas experiences a tradition in your family that your children will not soon forget.

Stars

Bundle up and go outside on a starry night. Take a blanket, lie down and look at the sky. What would it have looked like when the angels appeared in the sky to the shepherds? What would it be like as Mary and Joseph traveled through the desert? What do you think the wise men saw in the sky as they traveled to see Jesus?

Waiting

The people of Israel were waiting for a king for a long time. Talk with your kids about what it was like to wait for them to arrive in your family. To help your kids understand what it means to wait, let your child pick out a favorite small toy or candy bar. Put it somewhere they can see it, but don't let them touch it until Christmas Eve. On Christmas Eve, enjoy the treat as you read this book, and talk about what it feels like when you receive what you have been waiting for.

Angels

The angels we see in pictures and books are often cute babies with soft, feathery wings. But those aren't the kind of angels we read about in the Bible. Angels are God's messengers. They are warriors. You can read about angels in the first and second chapters of Luke in the Bible. Talk about what you think angels are like, based on what the Bible says about them.
